Primitive Hooking with Penny Appliqué

This course will appeal to all primitive hookers who are looking for an additional bit of inspiration in hooking and an escape from the whipped edge.

Working with textured and felted wool & pearl cotton, we will create layered “pennies” in a traditional pattern that is very comfortable beside hooked loops.

Bring a light-hearted approach to this class. You will learn about penny appliqué, how to combine hooking with appliqué on the same piece. Beatrice will have a variety of patterns that can be fully hooked, a combination of hooked and penny appliqué or completely penny appliqué. Each pattern can be used as a tablemat or a wall hanging. Supplies for pennies and hooking material will be available in class. Basic hooking knowledge is a requirement.
